E-LEARNING THEORY EXPLAINED

ADVANTAGES OF eLEARNING

At Safe Drive Training we can deliver classroom theory or eLearning theory about safe driving techniques. But since the content we have filmed is so well made, comprehensive and entertaining to watch we think it is rather redundant to be in a classroom playing the videos that participants can watch themselves. By allowing participants to interact with the eLearning, they can complete modules when it suits them and pause and rewind sections they don't understand.

By having participants complete the online modules prior to any practical driver training, it then allows our instructors to mentor (rather than train) since the participants have already completed the online modules covering all the essential underpinning knowledge. It also means that your personnel don't need to attend practical driver training for a full day, increasing their productivity and reducing time away from work. It is also less expensive to have the theory done via eLearning since an instructor is not running classroom sessions on repeat over many days and a classroom does not need to be hired.


When new personnel join your organization, driver training can be sourced immediately via this eLearning system. For larger users, the landing page and log-in screen can be themed with your company logo and/or additional safety modules or induction/training videos of your creation can be uploaded to the learning management system.

Your employees with children of driving age, will thank you for giving them the best knowledge to pass onto their children about safe driving. They can even play the videos on the TV at home and have the other drivers in their family watching the content (though only one certificate will be generated).

ONLINE THEORY: Pro's and Con's

- The quiz questions provide a legal record of the training undertaken and the users compliance with the safety principles and this verifies their understanding of the topics. This helps to mitigate legal issues that could arise from a vehicle crash involving your personnel (chain of responsibility legislation)
- Your personnel can access the modules when it suits them (logging in and out as required)
- Users can complete modules at home (even on the lounge with their family and teenagers watching)
- Videos are very high quality with great clips from stunts and experiments we filmed, plus simulator clips and real-world dashcam clips. This makes the modules both engaging and comprehensive
- You can choose the content your people get access too (we have modules on defensive driving, 4WD operation, secure driving and trailer towing). You can increase or decrease the course content
- In-built safeguards stop users skipping through the videos or doing other work on the device
- New employees can receive modules as an induction to your company/department (no training delay)
- Doing modules before the practical training, means the driver arrives knowledgeable and are often keen to expand on the learning already completed (putting the theory into practice)
- More practical driver training can be done as the participants have learnt the underpinning concepts before the course. Plus at some venues, a full day of practical driver training can be offered
- The same quality of training and same content is delivered to all participants (across Australia/Asia)
- Some people don't time manage very well and they end up rushing through the content and needing to do the modules the night before. Some people don't like eLearning and some struggle to login and navigate the system (although our portal is very easy to navigate and is user friendly)
- Your internet security firewall might prevent your personnel from accessing the videos at work

CLASSROOM THEORY: Pro's and Con's

- Classroom training is not usually assessed, so you have no legal record of the knowledge, understanding and compliance of your drivers. This could expose the company owners or senior managers to legal issues that could arise from a vehicle crash involving a staff member. They can say the training did not cover that topic or they misunderstood the theory (chain of responsibility legislation)
- Classroom lectures suit some people's learning style
- Less is covered in the timeframe due to rest breaks and the time management of the group
- More time is required at the training venue and at some venues a classroom needs to be hired increasing the course cost. Our instructors also need to be paid for a full day rather than half day.
- We will be playing the same videos from the eLearning modules during the classroom training
- Sending an instructor to run classroom lectures is less eco-friendly than delivery of eLearning theory
- Sometimes there are inter-personnel barrier between an instructor and certain participants which can limit the communication and message. Plus the instructor can be tired or unwell reducing the quality.

HOW IT WORKS

We create an account for your organization, with the modules you have selected made available. Participants are sent instructions and they sign-in using a unique password to verify themselves, they then create their own password and account. This allows them to quickly login whenever required.

Each module has an assessment quiz to verify the participants understanding of the content. This provides proof of the training provided to your personnel and their understanding of the concepts.

The system does not allow users to skip or fast forward the videos. They must watch them in full. We have access to see each user's time spent in a module and answers given to the questions.

A certificate is generated when all modules are completed with a 100% score on the quiz questions.


Clients can keep things simple and order the same content for all personnel. But let's say some of your staff drive 4WD capable vehicles or other staff tow trailers, then additional content can be ordered just for these participants.

When choosing content, please be aware that some content is designed to target driving attitudes and behaviors. So a topic like **Risk vs Reward** might sound simple or boring, when in fact it demonstrates how aggressive driving achieves nothing but burning excessive fuel and wearing brakes and tyres. The table of modules has an "Attitude Adjustment" column to highlight the modules that aim to improve the attitude of the driver by addressing the underlying causes of bad driving and crashes.

Feel free to discuss the content with SDT or we can sign someone up to review modules if required.

Trailer Towing Training

If your personnel tow a trailer for work purposes, then you are legally obligated to provide safety training to ensure that they know how to operate a vehicle with a trailer. It needs to be highlighted that the training a driver receives to obtain a driving licence, covers nothing about trailer towing or reversing with a trailer. Therefore any trailer awareness someone has gained is from self-developed experience and advice provided by others. If a trailer and/or vehicle is overloaded or incorrectly configured, there are legal and insurance ramifications that could void all insurance in the event of a crash.

To help companies provide trailer towing training, we have developed an inexpensive yet comprehensive online trailer towing package. The modules were made in conjunction with SEQWater (a Queensland government water utility) and as such are workplace compliant showing the safety procedures and checks that need to be made.

Training Venues

This training requires the availability of a suitable training area/facility. SDT can conduct defensive driving courses across Australia and the Asia-Pacific region. 
